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Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on- time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel this enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of refundable charges paid through attendance on the first day of class, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later. Cancellation occurs when the student gives written notice of cancellation to the Director, at the address of the School, shown on this agreement or by email to admissions@upasadena.org. CANCEL A COURSE: You have until: ____/____ to cancel. The student has the right to cancel from School at any time. If the student cancels from the course of instruction after the cancellation period, the School will remit a pro-rata refund for the unused portion of the tuition and other refundable charges. The amount of the refund is determined by deducting the nonrefundable fees from the total tuition charge, then dividing the number of hours in the course to calculate the hourly charge. The refund is the amount in excess of what the student owes for total hours of instruction completed, excluding the non-refundable \$250 for the Application and Registration fees.

All coursework is provided as distance learning/education. There are no classes or instruction taught at the school's location.

For Distance Learning Programs: When instruction is not offered in real time, the student shall have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund minus the nonrefundable charges before the first lesson and materials are received. Cancellation is effective on the date written and when notice of cancellation is sent.
