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### **Summary of Institution Mission and Student Achievement**

University of Pasadena (UPAS) was founded in 2012 by a group of eminent educationists and entrepreneurs with a vision to create an educational institution that will enable our students to be competent professionals and lifelong learners with affordable access to high quality, learning-centered and outcomes-based distance education.

#### Institution Mission Statement:

“To provide students worldwide with outcome-based, multi-modal, technology-enabled graduate level distance education that can empower them to achieve their professional goals.”

To achieve its mission UPAS offers outcome based Master of Arts in Education using multi-modal technology with a program duration of 24 months. To achieve their professional goal and as a graduation requirement students should complete 36 credit hours in the chosen field of study with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at end of the program.

Student achievement is determined through a variety of measures including, but not limited to, graduation rates reported for a calendar year as reported annually, the number of graduates for the most recent academic year. These measures assist UPAS in knowing that it is meeting its institutional mission.

### **Aggregated Institutional Data on Student Achievement**

#### Institution Graduation Rate

University of Pasadena student population is mostly of adult learners who are completing their programs while managing professional and personal life.

University of Pasadena calculation of graduation rates is as follows:

Graduation rates were calculated based on the normal completion time of 24 months (100% of normal completion time).

Enrolled students include those students who are in attendance as of Day 8 of the first course in their required sequence and who have met all admissions criteria for the degree program as defined by the academic catalog in effect during the cohort year.

Average Institution Graduation Rate for program: 88.89 %

The table below indicates graduation rates, categorized by program, for cohorts enrolled in 2019 and graduated as per recommended schedule of 24 months:

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## Total Number of Graduates by Program

University of Pasadena graduation requirements are as follows

- Satisfactory completion of 36 credit hours in the chosen field of study.
- The capstone project submitted by the student as part of the graduate program has to be approved by our university faculty committee for an award of Master's degree.
- A 10 week supervised internship must be completed and an internship report should be submitted which is evaluated by faculty.
- Minimum 70% of the credits towards the degree must be taken from UPAS.
- Cumulative GPA must be 3.0 or higher.
- All graduate students are expected to complete the degree program within 3 years from the date of enrollment after which a request has to be made to the admission department in the university asking for an extension. Continuous request for extension will not be encouraged and the student will be dropped from the program and won't be eligible for a degree.
